Most of their families come from poor backgrounds and cannot afford their health care costs. Nonetheless, all of these children, along with special needs education, require special attention over their health and well-being.

Therefore, this past July, ABBS organized a medical camp in partnership with Dr. Kaleb and his wife Dr. Sadiکشya Budha. Their generous time and love benefitted the students, who were treated for deworming and advised over other physical and medical conditions. HDCS would like to thank them for their selfless service and we hope that we may be able to organize many more health camps, even a dental camp, in the future, which will greatly benefit these children.

**Celebrating 14 years of Afno FM in Dadeldhura**



**It Started with Two Men and a Suitcase**

On June 14<sup>th</sup>, 2008, Mr. Bob McLeod and Vijay Manandhar were looking for a place to set up the first radio station in far-west Dadeldhura. They were carrying a suitcase radio and searching for an appropriate and safe space to set up a radio station.

It was a major task to find a suitable place in Dadeldhura. They encountered discrimination for being Christian, as the locals did not want to rent a space in their home to a Christian organization. Finally, after many days of arduous pursuit they decided to approach the pastor at Dadeldhura church. The staff from the church agreed to provide a space for setting up the radio to broadcast.

Ceremoniously, for the very first time in the far-west region of Dadeldhura, Nepal's national anthem: "Sayaun Thunga Phool Ka" played on the radio, followed by announcements and an introduction to Afno FM radio station. Eventually, they went on to build a radio tower, in order to gain greater broadcasting capacity to reach more people. Even though, since 2008, the radio station has moved twice, it has not put a stop to broadcasting news and programs that uplift, educate and empower the people of Dadeldhura.

In spite of all the hurdles over the years, we joyously celebrated Afno FM, Dadeldhura's 14 years of establishment this past June, which took place at Bethesda Home, an orphanage housing 12 boys. We provided the orphanage with essential food items to last them for at least 3 months. We also equipped them with stationery materials for their educational needs. Orphanages like theirs are always in need of support and Afno FM staff were thrilled to be able to support them and share the love of Christ. Please continue to pray for Afno FM staff and the work that they do, as they hope to be role models for many people and to inspire them to take up good works for people in need.
